The residency is designed to provide recent BFA and BA graduates with skills in wood, metal, glass, ceramics, fabric, plaster, or other sculptural materials with concentrated time and space in our studios and shops to explore and define their work in the field of sculpture. Many students come to post-baccalaureate programs to prepare to apply to graduate programs and residencies. Most students stay for two semesters. Students are required to register for three to six credits of one Sculpture course to receive access to the following:

RESIDENCY HIGHLIGHTS

- Access to a large woodshop, metal shop, glass shop, CNC room, and plaster room for the entire semester, Monday through Friday, 9am-5pm.
- Private studio space to work in, a desk and a small studio space, next to undergraduate Sculpture majors 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- Working with Jared Holt in the Sculpture Shop and Moshe Bursuker in the Glass Shop.
- Weekly meetings with faculty to establish goals typically to build a portfolio that will get them into a Residency or Graduate program.
- Experience as a Teaching Assistant with <u>Caroline Woolard</u> and/or <u>Hirokazu Fukawa</u>, pending budget approval.

- Working alongside Post-Bac students in ceramics, who are advised by <u>Matt Towers</u>, <u>Nathan Carnes</u>, and <u>Matthew Dercole</u> with guest artists for 2019/2020 TBA.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- a BFA or a BA with an emphasis on Sculpture
- experience working with a CNC machine and/or in wood, metal, plaster, glass, sewing, fabric, ceramics, and/or other sculptural materials.
- the ability to support faculty as a Teaching Assistant, pending budget approval.
- the ability to work independently as well as with a group.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Working as a Teaching Assistant with Caroline Woolard and/or Hirokazu Fukawa.
- Being in dialog with Sculpture undergraduates; fostering a supportive environment.
- Residing in or around Hartford, CT for the semester (New Haven is 45 minutes away from the <u>Hartford Art School</u>).
